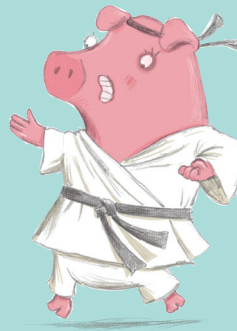
Haiku Binoculars

Haiku is a form of poetry that zooms in on the small things you see around you. A haiku might be about a bird, or a leaf, or even the gum you stepped on yesterday. Follow the directions to make these haiku binoculars, hold them up to your eyes, pick an object to focus on, and write a haiku about what you see!

Remember, a haiku has three lines. The first line has five syllables, the middle line has seven syllables, and the last line has five syllables.

You will need:

- two cardboard tubes
- glue
- wax paper
- decorating materials (optional)



Directions: Put a line of glue down the side of a cardboard tube, and glue the two tubes together. They should be shaped like a pair of binoculars. Set the tubes on the wax paper to dry. Once the glue is completely dry, you can decorate your binoculars however you like. Then they are ready to use!
